

Brad Welch, General Manager for TPL Systems, recently presented on the topic of critical messaging at the ARCIA Perth one day conference. He discussed the evolution of messaging technologies for emergency responders, from early paging systems to modern cellular technologies and smart phone apps. He highlighted the importance of using a combination of these technologies to ensure reliable and resilient message delivery in emergency situations. Welch also introduced LoRaWAN, a new technology that can be added to this mix and is currently being used by some agencies in Europe. In his presentation, he explored the possibilities of using LoRaWAN for critical messaging in Australia, discussed available infrastructure, and presented case studies of how LoRaWAN is being used in critical messaging. Welch provided an overview of LoRaWAN, explained how it works, and discussed the advantages and disadvantages of using this technology for critical messaging. His presentation was informative and thoughtprovoking, offering attendees new ideas and potential solutions for improving emergency response in Australia.
